



‘I am sobbing’: Mother orca still carrying her dead calf — 16 days later

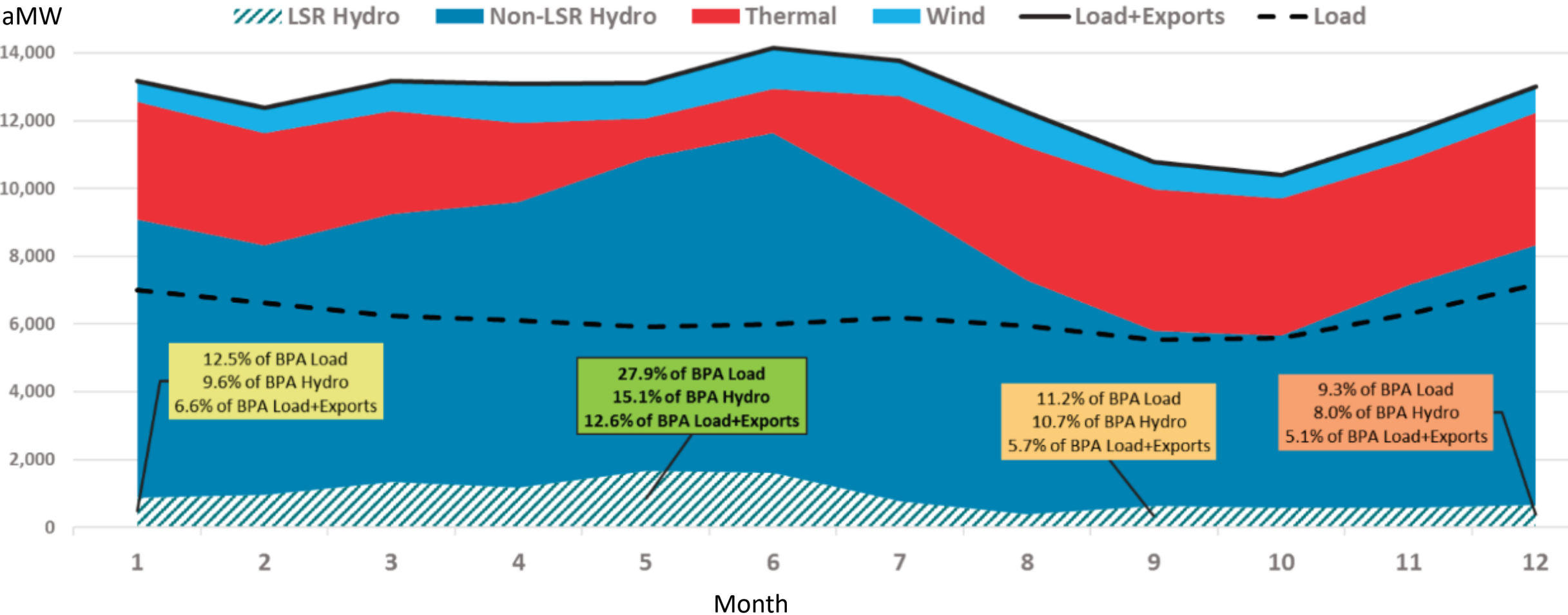

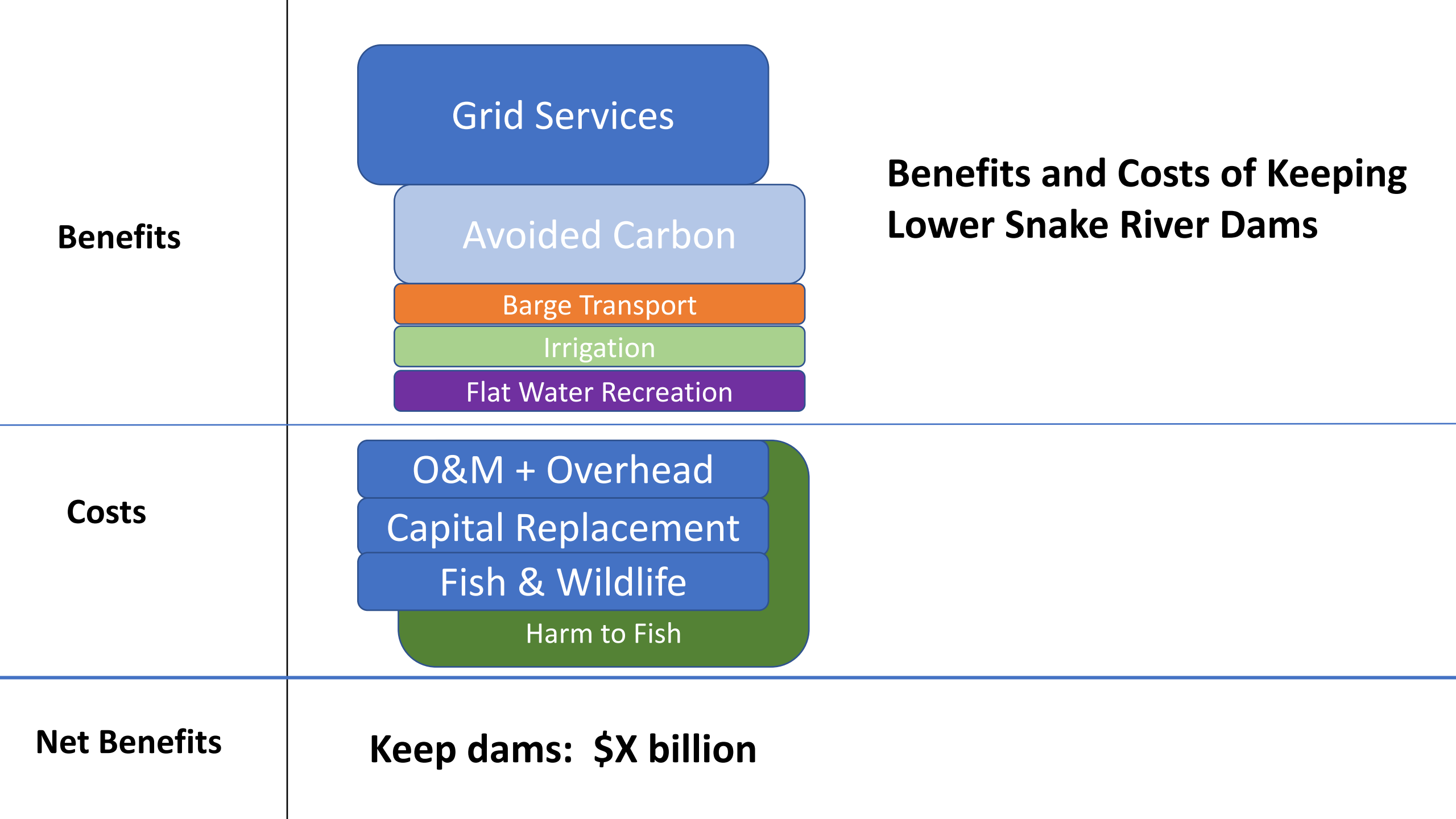
